My name is Dave Parsons. I'm the deputy director for resource advocacy at the US Department of Energy's Office of Electricity.

[David Parsons] 14:06:27

So thank you all for joining today and I also want to echo. Thanks for your patience and flexibility.

We've worked over the past year to open up this application window and respond to your concept papers and get to this point.

[David Parsons] 14:06:43

Okay, so let's dive in. So, on the next slide. Oh, one more actually.

[David Parsons] 14:06:50

The office of electricity leads, the Department of Energy's research development, demonstration, and deployment efforts to strengthen and modernize our nation's power grid and maintain a reliable, affordable, and secure electricity delivery infrastructure.

Our main execution goals focus on stabilizing, optimizing, and growing the United States electric grid. We're working to address the immediate acute needs that are straining grid reliability, getting improved.

Performance from the grid while maintaining affordability. And expanding grid capacity and tapping into our many energy resources.

[David Parsons] 14:07:30

Okay, so on the next slide, as I'm sure everyone is well aware. let's go one more slide actually. Thanks.

So, I'm sure you all know, but over the past couple of years, the US has seen a surge in electric demand.

[David Parsons] 14:07:49

This is primarily driven by data center development, large industrial customers and increased domestic manufacturing. There are many forecasts available out there and there's definitely uncertainty in some of the segments.

Specific segments in some of these forecasts. But in general, we expect that electricity usage is going to grow substantially over the next 5 years.

[David Parsons] 14:08:12

It both in terms of electricity consumption and in peak demand. And our industry, our states, our regional planning practices and these frameworks are not always well equipped to accommodate all these requests.

There are new challenges associated with them, the particular kinds of loads that we're seeing trying to interconnect.

[David Parsons] 14:08:33

Of course, there's many challenges with them, the particular kinds of loads that we're seeing, trying to interconnect.

Of course, there's many challenges with supply chain, with availability of new electric generation. Permitting and, and other aspects of, of these complicated processes and, and this industry in particular.

So, to address some of the reliability and security and economic growth and national security issues associated with. What we're seeing, the Department of Energy is using this Carla funding opportunity to develop innovative solutions to solve these challenges.

So, let's go to the next slide and I'll talk a little more about this in particular.

[David Parsons] 14:09:14

So, the main objective here is to engage a collaborative or many collaboratives to develop new approaches for states, grid operators, and large energy customers to meet reliably and affordably to serve all of these large load requests.

Collaboratives that are developed as part of this program should reflect a wide range of needs and use cases related to load growth across the country and should include organizations of varying sizes and experience with government programs and government funding.

The collaboratives are going to provide support for analyzing electricity demand growth, planning for generation and grid capacity, and identifying opportunities to serve new customers and ensure reliable and affordable service.

[David Parsons] 14:10:01

We're hoping that as part of the program, the collaboratives will make use of new approaches and develop new approaches for site identification, load forecasting, grid planning, cost allocation, cost recovery structures, etc., to enable rapid accommodation of these load and interconnection requests and support the needed infrastructure development.

To accommodate all the customers that are out there.

[David Parsons] 14:10:34

So let's talk a little more about eligibility. So.

Applicants must be a domestic entity, which is defined here. As well okay so there's you can read the definition, but you must be a domestic entity the project team has to include at least one state entity, at least one grid operator has to include at least one state entity, at least one grid operator and at least one grid operator, at least one grid operator, and at least one large load customer or large load developer

proponent. The state entity is going to need to be the lead or the kind of prime applicant.

And all as part of the eligibility requirement there there's a couple other pieces in there, but one important thing is that applicants must certify they're not controlled by a foreign entity.

On the next slide, I'm going to talk about the overall process. So, the application is intended to be pretty straightforward and reasonable for folks.

You should include a project narrative, a maximum of 9 pages, and this would be 2 to 5 pages on your project proposal, one to 2 pages on the team members and resources that you'll bring to bear.

One to 2 pages on your budget. The budget workbook should be filled out. There's an option to include a Gantt chart for the schedule, the tasks and milestones, etc.

We also would like you to include your resumes for your key personnel, any letters of support or commitments that you have from project partners.

These can be uploaded. Application and your resumes and letters of support etc. Those don't count toward your page limits, but there is a 1 page maximum per letter.

Okay. Okay, so on to timeline. So we had previously asked for concept papers and, although they're not required, they were highly encouraged.

Those who have submitted a concept paper have already been provided with a concept paper have already been provided with feedback from DOE.

Those who have submitted a concept paper have already been provided with feedback from DOE about your concept paper. So, thank you very much for those of you who submitted concept papers.

In 2 weeks on Thursday the 20 second of We will have another session similar to this. We will do, we call office hours.

We highly encourage you to submit your applications on time if you don't submit, on time, any kind of late submissions, we won't review those.

Okay. I'm going to talk a little bit about the criteria for review. And then I think we can wrap up.

So. The main component of the applications that we're going to score is the technical merit and impact.

[David Parsons] 14:14:17

So, this refers to the potential the projects have to allow for rapidly accommodating significant load growth while preventing or minimizing cost impact on customers.

[David Parsons] 14:14:27

We will also evaluate how the project will support analyzing or preparing for load impact. Or planning for an enabling grid capacity growth.

[David Parsons] 14:14:36

In addition, we're looking at the impact of the funding from DOE, how this proposed project is helpful and how it can be applied in the broader industry.

[David Parsons] 14:14:47

Okay, let's go to the next slide. The next 2 review criteria are project approach and feasibility and the team member qualifications and capabilities.

[David Parsons] 14:14:58

So these are pretty self-explanatory. But we'll score your applications based on how well scoped and feasible the proposed project is, including the outlined project management approaches, the project budget, the schedule, etc.

And finally, we'll also score your application on your team qualifications and capabilities. So this includes ensuring the necessary partnerships are in place.

[David Parsons] 14:15:24

For project success and there is effective project organization. Among the partners, the key personnel are qualified for the work that's proposed, etc.

Okay, so that wraps it up I think I'll conclude now and I believe we have plenty of time for any questions or anything that folks might have.

Thanks very much.

[Grayson Dorr] 14:15:48

Thanks, Dave. Before we jump in, I'll kind of address some of the ones, questions that have come through.

[Grayson Dorr] 14:15:54

Regarding or specific to the application, is Dave kind of touched on and went into the details the form online and the templates we have available align with those that are required, a submission documents.

[Grayson Dorr] 14:16:10

So, the project narrated budget workbook and project schedule. Each of those have templates available. The summary slide and the letters to support, there are no templates.

[Grayson Dorr] 14:16:20

Those are optional. As we highlight, if you would like to include a summary slide, you can do that via PowerPoint or PDF, whatever your preference would be, but via PowerPoint or PDF, whatever your preferences are, but feel free to use the project narrative opening page.

That as well. So just to remind everyone of that, and so I know we there was a couple questions just around.

Those requirements and documents pertaining to it. We don't get into the specifics as far as.

You know, beyond the page count as far as specifying. Fonts and that type of thing, we really just hope everyone uses their best judgment on that.

Again, it's, it's Up to Do's review, but if you submit beyond 9 pages, They have full discretion to stop reviewing after that period.

[Grayson Dorr] 14:17:13

And so, please be mindful of that and, and target to keep all of your submissions, at that maximum page.

Account as far as pertaining to the project narrative. So thank you for that. Again, that application will be cut off at 3 PM.

[Grayson Dorr] 14:17:32

Eastern time. So if you were trying to submit or starting your application during that time and not submitting until after that window, it will close the link and not allow you to submit.

[Grayson Dorr] 14:17:44

So the earlier the better with that and so we can help troubleshoot to have any issues.

[Grayson Dorr] 14:17:52

So again, I see a couple questions coming in just regarding in concept papers. Be mindful that this opportunity open in early last year and so that was not a requirement.

To submit a concept paper, it was just a way to provide that feedback and we recognize folks may just be joining us or seeing this post through since our network has grown.

[Grayson Dorr] 14:18:17

So again, that's not a requirement that you had to have that concept paper in. So we will check and make sure I see a question around that feedback.

[Grayson Dorr] 14:18:25

Yeah, everyone who did submit one was supplied and either encouraged discourage. On that and so we'll confirm.

[Grayson Dorr] 14:18:33

That you did receive that. So.

[Grayson Dorr] 14:18:38

All right, let's. I believe that's overall. Some of the general admin questions pertaining to it.

There's a question that kind of 1st came through Dave and Please correct me if I over speak on this.

[Grayson Dorr] 14:18:54

The expected start date. I'll just say that the goal of this is to make selections.

[Grayson Dorr] 14:19:00

In the spring. Dave and his team notified ConnectWerx the approval to post the solicitation close date, we did that and obviously wanted to move very quickly on that.

So our commitment obviously is to the DOE to move at the cadence they are pushing towards so selections in spring.

[Grayson Dorr] 14:19:21

Obviously, everyone's aware of this close in January. There has to be time for reviews, approvals, but we are anticipating those negotiations and the work as far as the selectees to commence in the spring and then move everyone to contract shortly after.

So Dave, correct me if that's if I'm overstating there.

[David Parsons] 14:19:41

No, no, that's right. And I think, you know, obviously all the caveats of, you know, making sure we have all the right approvals internally and everything would apply to that but that's our intent and in terms of the timeline.

I believe this is on the website for folks, but we're expecting a 1 year period of performance and there's options to extend that I believe you know up to 2 additional one year periods of performance.

So. For total, I guess, of up to 3 years. So anyway, that's on the website as well for folks.

[David Parsons] 14:20:16

If just to kind of refer to.

[Grayson Dorr] 14:20:18

Yeah, thank you, David. There's a question around that. So, if please.

[Grayson Dorr] 14:20:23

Craft your proposal around that 12 month and you were able to if you need to specify the need to extend and that would all be negotiated obviously should you be selected.

[Grayson Dorr] 14:20:37

For award.

[Grayson Dorr] 14:20:41

Questions we've had come in, Dave, are on funding size. Obviously, everyone's aware and we posted online the total available funding for this the goal or expectation is to make around 5 to 10 awards so the funding for that would be obviously allocated across just under 29, but 29 million.

[Grayson Dorr] 14:21:03

So. Again, that will vary based on the project proposals that come in.

[Grayson Dorr] 14:21:10

Question on can the funds be used for capital goods such as natural gas fuel cell and for engineering consulting services.

[Grayson Dorr] 14:21:19

Dave, I'll just add and to this and clarify for everyone this is, if you're not familiar, firm fixed price agreement.

[Grayson Dorr] 14:21:29

It's milestone based and so all of your sub awards and sub agreements DOE does not request to see those nor do we ask for approval of those nor do we ask for approval of those ahead of time so any specifications stable and what's not allowed as far as those, the funding.

[David Parsons] 14:21:47

It's a good question. I think we should take that one back, Grayson, and provide sort of a kind of an official answer, which we can do and kind of get back to folks on that one.

[Grayson Dorr] 14:21:56

Okay.

[David Parsons] 14:21:56

On the capital question.

[Grayson Dorr] 14:22:01

A question Dave came in and I know we've had this the just further defining what a large load user is that on a daily annual power consumption what qualifies as a grid operator from DOE's perspective.

[Grayson Dorr] 14:22:15

So I, we can break those apart.

[David Parsons] 14:22:17

Yeah, I think. Let us put something again like on the website that kind of explains the definition of a large load user.

[David Parsons] 14:22:28

I mean, I think in general we're looking for, you know, large commercial industrial customers data centers manufacturing facilities large industrial users but we can put a kind of a criterion or something that better defines that for folks if that's helpful.

[David Parsons] 14:22:49

In terms of the, I see it so there's a question about the grid operator. So that's pretty broad in our mind.

[David Parsons] 14:22:54

I think that includes utilities, you know, RTOs, ISOs, but, but generally.

[David Parsons] 14:23:01

You know even like a transmission owner operator could potentially qualify there too so that's pretty broad and then if I'm looking at the right one the word decision.

[David Parsons] 14:23:14

I think we addressed that one already.

[Grayson Dorr] 14:23:15

Yeah, we touched on just the spring. Yeah, spring as far as making decision and then. And I know another question which we touched on just regarding sub awards, as I mentioned, the agreement.

[Grayson Dorr] 14:23:30

And the business of disagreement and the milestones are set with the prime. So the sub award in all of those contracts and how they're reimbursed.

[Grayson Dorr] 14:23:39

We don't get into specifics on that. So that's up to the prime to manage that.

[Grayson Dorr] 14:23:48

Dave, I don't know if we're able to. Answer this or specific just Texas qualify for this application.

[David Parsons] 14:23:51

Yeah.

[Grayson Dorr] 14:23:55

With their own grid.

[David Parsons] 14:23:57

Oh yeah, absolutely.

[Grayson Dorr] 14:24:03

Yeah, and there's another question just I think you touched on it just does a Ver vertically integrated utility qualifies a system operator team members?

[Grayson Dorr] 14:24:12

Does it have to be? And Dave said yes, you can so thank you for that. Lot of great questions coming in.

[David Parsons] 14:24:14

Yep. Yeah.

[Grayson Dorr] 14:24:21

So thank you, everyone.

[Grayson Dorr] 14:24:25

So a question just regarding, so it says since submitting the concept paper, some of the project partners have decided not to participate.

[Grayson Dorr] 14:24:32

We may we submit an application with new partners. Yes, you can. We fully recognize that a lot has changed in our world in the last 6 months, 9 months.

And so, a lot has changed in our world in the last 6 months, 9 months. And so, even if you were discouraged on a concept paper, but you feel that what you supplied merits another opportunity we fully you know encourage you to still do so that was just intended to allow do we an opportunity, early look, provide some insights as far as, full submission and so you're

still eligible obviously to apply. We're not going to restrict you for that.

[Grayson Dorr] 14:25:15

Can we touched on, the Gantt template, the template setup?

[Grayson Dorr] 14:25:20

It is 18 months. That's just a general template that we use across all solicitations and opportunities.

[Grayson Dorr] 14:25:24

So, you Again, keep that focus around the 12-month period if you need to justify sending it out.

[Grayson Dorr] 14:25:32

Be able to do so.

[Grayson Dorr] 14:25:42

Okay, we've touched on there's a question regarding how our funds distributed. Again, as I said, it's a firm Fix Press Agreement.

[Grayson Dorr] 14:25:49

That agreement is with ConnectWerx and the performer. Funds are paid out. Upon DOE, review and approval on a net 30 payment schedule in arrears.

[Grayson Dorr] 14:25:59

So think of it as your If you had 12 milestones and maybe 8 invoices tied to those milestones you would invoice at the completion of each of those they would be reviewed on the ConnectWerx side for completion and then sent over for DOE for concurrence and then paid appropriately after that time.

[Grayson Dorr] 14:26:24

So again, yes, specific questions on the funds and like how that's structured. That is all that will all be decided in the negotiation.

[Grayson Dorr] 14:26:31

Period and really a collaborative effort from DOE and the performer to come up with a set of milestones and invoices that provide enough runway and financial support early, middle, and end of the project.

[Grayson Dorr] 14:26:49

But also are tied to key deliverables.

[Grayson Dorr] 14:26:58

There's a question regarding, saving the submission or does it have to need to be done all it one time?

[Grayson Dorr] 14:27:05

It does need to be completed, I believe, getting in this specifics. Will capture. Your inputs, but we just recommend always downloading all the attachments, get everything ready to go.

[Grayson Dorr] 14:27:17

And then when you're ready to submit, the question set that are in the actual application. Most of those are intended for just data metrics and just, consistently captured across or not specific to the project.

[Grayson Dorr] 14:27:31

So, best practice, just get everything downloaded, work offline. That's the reason we have the project narrative template.

[Grayson Dorr] 14:27:38

That's the meat of the application and then when you're ready to submit. Shouldn't just allocate at least 30 min or so to finish that up.

[Grayson Dorr] 14:27:50

All right.

[Grayson Dorr] 14:27:57

Let's see.

[Grayson Dorr] 14:28:04

There's a question just regarding missing the concept paper unfortunately with this solicitation being open, we're not able to provide any pre review or feedback of considerations of your application.

So just take the time use not only This time in the coming weeks, office hours if you have those final questions to formulate your response.

Before the deadline.

[Grayson Dorr] 14:28:35

Another question, Dave, just on funds regarding travel. Is that something we want to take offline and put all in a complete as far as allowable or?

[David Parsons] 14:28:46

Yeah. No, I think. That's allowed. I think it can be included in your proposal if that's part of your budget.

[David Parsons] 14:28:54

So you can just, you know. Lay that out in your submission.

[Grayson Dorr] 14:29:09

There's a question I'm not tracking as far as specifics if you're able to.

[Grayson Dorr] 14:29:15

To provide more clarity on it. I think we can get you an answer, but it's saying.

[Grayson Dorr] 14:29:21

Are applying entities assigned IDs or control numbers applicants should be including in full application materials. So if you were if you did submit a concept paper there's no idea tied to that.

[Grayson Dorr] 14:29:35

You're simply just reapplying. So, I don't. Hope that answers the question that you don't need to worry with that.

[Grayson Dorr] 14:29:42

But please, there's more specifics to that. Follow up and we'll.

[Grayson Dorr] 14:29:47

We'll try to. Iterate off that further.

[Grayson Dorr] 14:29:56

A question regarding can partners contract with connect works directly if awarded or do we have to subcontract to the state energy office so that would be through the state energy office so connect works for this particular agreement, we have a deal we do not manage sub awards.

[Grayson Dorr] 14:30:14

So thank you for asking that.

[David Parsons] 14:30:20

And, Grace, and I think there was another question about, you know, whether the state or no large load customer needed to have a budget or could have like different kinds of.

Partnerships or different kinds of collaboration and I think the intent is for flexibility around how the collaboratives are designed, but we do have a restriction where the lead or the sort of primary applicant needs to be the state or PUC entity, but that that doesn't mean that and that's the end that will have the award, you know, with Connect Works and the agreement with Connect Works.

And as Grayson was saying, you know, how the kind of subs are arranged and how that works out is up to, you know, the applicant to propose.

Thanks, David. We've seen, you know, with others where we have awards with a small consortiums that obviously all will be included and invited on those, those calls and how we set it up if that's the structure and approach you want to take.

So when we actually started this. Solicitation last year. It was coming at a grid deployment office a couple of months ago, DOE.

We did a realignment and now the grid deployment office is part of the office of electricity. So you'll see sort of going forward reference office electricity, but it's the same opportunity.

You know, so, so it's really hopefully won't be any different for folks on the outside.

Let me see if I can answer one of these questions. So, there was a question about. Going back to the project period if the proposal can be for a 3-year project or if it could be a 1 year.

So I think the way it's structured is going to be for a 1-year project with the option to extend.

But I think if you have a project approach that really would benefit from being, you know, 2436 month project. I think that's fine.

I think it just make sure that your approach is flexible enough that you could accommodated if, you know, DOE decided it was just going to be a 12 month project and also just show in your proposal how or what the benefit would be or why it should be a 24 or 36 month project if you think That would be beneficial.

And that will give us the flexibility to kind of think about your approach and your proposal and also just sort of accommodate the kind of default contract period which should be for 12 months.

Thanks, and it's important everyone that I just be mindful that we'll be moving into cadence with all the performers, right?

And so some will. May have justification for that 24 months or, or further some. Maybe operating and choose to operate strictly on that 12 month or even sooner.

Though all everyone will be going at different. Operating different periods of performance but a lot of that is intended to try to streamline and align.

All the projects together as well. So, but we do recognize there's some variances there.

A question again just on the particular project team submitting the application again it needs to come from that entity.

I won't get into the weeds of if someone is submitting on behalf, but the key is the prime and the award would be with that state entity.

So again, I would just coordinate with them if you're able, I think, best case, it's always recommended to have someone on that side submitting it, but we recognize.

Some might be doing a lot of the leg work for them and doing that. So.

So there's a question here about the overall goal and you know whether our goal is to have a repeatable process that can streamline and condense timelines for interconnecting new loads and new generation.

And I think that is one of the one of the objectives. Yeah, I think it would be great to have some kind of approach that's developed to a collaborative that's applicable in other parts of the country.

Part of the objective so for this so I think you can see on the opportunity page at Connect Works sort of like the full list of objectives and the sort of review criteria which includes sort of you know how this approach could be have broader applicability and how the impact of DOI funding could be maximized that way.

There is no cap on that, but just be mindful. Other reviews and the volume as well. So just, we always recommend keep those specific to the project and, but there is no official cap on those.

That you may be uploading or a requirement to do so. A question regarding will reviewers be asking questions of applicants midway through the review process.

That is not typical that we have that included in the review period. But there has been times where as we close or get close to closing their review period, DOE may have a selected pool of applicants they may want to ask clarifying questions for.

But currently in the process it's not designed to pause and ask or provide feedback, clarifying questions midway through, but we always want to reserve for DOE their opportunity if they need to ask any.

Clarifying questions and those will be asked. Typically to all performers it would be a maybe something there was an oversight or just clarifying across the board today, is that is that fair to say as far as in the review process?

Yeah, I think that's right. Right now we don't have, a step in the process that that contemplates that, but that you're right, we have done that in the past and that could change depending on sort of what we see in the application pool and sort of our needs in terms of reviewing.

But other than that, that's specific to DOE's national labs. Other than that, other subcontractors or project partners or anyone else who's part of the collaborative would need to be to work together with the state or PC, the state, the lead entity, the lead applicant.

And that as Grayson was saying before, that's kind of up to the collaborative to determine sort of the structure and the approach that they want to take in terms of project partners.

There's a question Dave, one of my favorites coming from a public power utility myself, but does a public power entity that is a subdivision of a public power utility myself, but does a public power entity that is a subdivision of a state qualifies the lead applicant.

I'm assuming they're mentioning like a quasi state entity that operates under. A state RS or is that correct?

That's eligible.

Yeah, so for that, could you send for the person who asked that question, could you send, your question in to connect works to the Connect Works email so that we can look at the specific circumstance that you're talking about.

Just to make sure that we don't. Have any issues there. I, the, the reason why I'm saying is actually there's maybe a little more than folks need, but the, the restriction on sort of the, the prime and everything is, not, it's sort of more tied to the funding source than anything else.
